Some Updated Facts About Finances at Resurrection, Rockdale: Your Priest's Unvarnished View

Once again, we come to the time of year when we as a Christian community decide what the mission and ministry of Resurrection, Rockdale will be for the coming calendar year by deciding what financial resources we will make available for carrying out that mission. As I thought about how to approach this once more, I reread what I said last year about this. Much of it seems to be true this year as well [The stuff that isn't still as important or as true you'll see has been excised]. Rather than reinventing my own wheel, I've adapted what I wrote last year. So here's a new, updated version of some thoughts you may not have heard often (particularly from clergy) in the past:

1. **Resurrection, Rockdale operates leanly and efficiently.** There is a real cost-consciousness as decisions are made about how we do things (and which things we do). The emphasis on doing things ourselves if we can (e.g., an incredible number of repairs made by Property Committee members and others [most of which are really important, but are behind the scenes, so you probably haven't noticed] is one good indicator of that.) Shadow side of this: We have had a tendency in the past to defer maintenance or expenses beyond what is optimal for carrying out our parish's mission. [We let the place run down so we can't do what we need to do as a parish.] A piece of good news is that much of the large deferred maintenance has been addressed. Or so we hope until we learn differently. Our present big property project: bringing the Sextons' House up to livability standards.
2. **The members of our parish support it with generous gifts of time, effort, and money.** The fact is that we have achieved financial stability because of two things:


(1) the generosity of our members—Pledges have been made at levels which this parish has not seen in its immediate past, and those pledges have been paid on time (or ahead!); and (2) Many people have taken on tasks of all kinds; The stewardship of money is matched by generous gifts of time, talent, and effort. We have much to do in terms of increasing the number of people who lead and staff the many functions that make up the life of our parish. *Too much still falls on too few shoulders, especially Vestry shoulders.* Remember—the membership group that gets to come to Church now and then, comment on what others are doing, but never lift a hand themselves—that group has been closed. All of us are called to be active partners in our parish’s mission and life. Much has been done in this area; much remains to be accomplished.

3. **The Emergency Alarms Aren’t Blasting, But We Can’t Slack Off.** Our finances are more stable than they have been in some time. That is totally dependent on the generosity of money, time, and talent cited in the last paragraph. If this parish decreases its commitment, we’ll reenter the dire straits from which we have just extracted ourselves. We need to keep up the growth in generous financial commitment we as a parish have made and the increase in people stepping up to support the life and ministry of Resurrection. We’re in a better place; we all need to do our part to keep us there.
4. **Resurrection, Rockdale will be expending more money in 2019 to do what it does in 2018.** A number of new or increased expenses will naturally flow from our pursuing our mission goals. Others may include budgeting for oil usage and snow removal at a level which does not count on an unusually mild winter, repairing the steeple on the Church so it doesn’t give us rain inside the Church as well as outside, putting in the budget some things we always do but haven’t budgeted for this year, and this list could go on and on. Just doing what we do now will be more expensive in money than it has been. And by a fair amount.
5. **Engaging in renewed and expanded Programs with our mission goals will take money.** There will be a number of new and renewed programs that Resurrection, Rockdale will want to undertake as we move forward, reaching out in love and service to our community and building up the bonds of love and friendship among our own congregation. There needs to be some money unallocated for anything else so that won’t be a problem when we discover that our Resurrection, Rockdale mission is growing and renewing at a pace even faster than we have in the past.
6. **This affects you and your actions directly.** Some parishes have one or two “angels” who take primary responsibility for the financial life of the parish (and usually end up making most of the big decisions concerning the parish as well). The good news is that Resurrection, Rockdale doesn’t have that kind of decision-making system; we are all part of the decisions that get made about our ministry and mission as a parish. The challenging part of that news is that supporting those decisions with our gifts (of money, time, and effort) is a job for *all* of us. There is

no “them” to take that over from us. This means that “just the same as last year” or “add a little on to what we’re doing now” won’t make the kinds of things happen that Resurrection, Rockdale wants to do and to be for 2019 with our mission, goals, and programs. So **you** have to step up and renew your relationship with Resurrection, Rockdale. **Each of you reading this.** No one else will take up the slack for you. Your decision will make the difference.

These are the facts as I see them. As you make your financial pledge for 2019, please think and pray and act according to how you are led by the Spirit. Resurrection, Rockdale matters. Your prayers matter. Your support in word and action matters. Your money matters. Your time matters. Your help matters. God has blessed Resurrection, Rockdale in so many ways. Make yourself a strengthened instrument of that blessing during 2019.
